<u>Class A</u> In Hand this class is for the Amateur handler (as defined in AHS Rules of Showing) and Amateur Horse (not to have been professionally trained either at home or stabled with a professional handler). Open to any colt, gelding, mare, filly or stallion any age Pure-bred or part bred.

<u>Class B</u> In Hand this class is the Amateur handler (as defined in AHS Rules of Showing) and horse (HAVE been professionally trained either at home or stabled with a professional handler) Open to any colt, gelding, mare, filly or stallion any age pure-bred or part bred.

<u>Class AA Ridden</u> This class is for the Amateur Rider (as defined in AHS Rules of Showing) and Amateur Horse (not to have been professionally trained either at home or stabled with a professional producer), or ridden even once at a show by a professional. Open to any horse over the age of 4 years of age, stallion, mare or gelding.

<u>Class BB Ridden</u> This Class is for the Amateur Rider (as defined in AHS Rules of Showing) and horse HAS been professionally trained either at home or stabled with a professional producer open to any horse of the age of 4 years of age, stallion, mare or gelding.

NOTE: there will be NO championships held at the regional shows, just the qualifying classes

The judge will be judging the Handler more than the horse and points will be awarded depending on the placing in the class. All 1st to 3rd place placings will then be eligible to go

forward to the Championship which will be held at BACS, Pickering Grange Leicester 7th September 2024 (you will have a chance to increase your points as qualifying classes will also be held at BACS) The Championship will be judged as a separate class and Champion will be awarded £250 and Reserve will be awarded £100 kindly donated by DMG Arabians. The overall highest points winners in A and B, which have been accumulated over the year will receive a trophy and rosette kindly donated by Silverdale Arabians at BACS

Ranking & Scoring

Points will be collected by individual handler and one horse, should you wish to enter more classes you must purchase another qualifying card (cards for one handler one horse). Every handler will win points according to his/her placing in the classes. Double points will be awarded at the National Show, David Broome Centre, Chepstow $19^{th} - 21^{st}$ July 2024

If you are in a spilt class (split at 10 entries) all classes will be awarded full points.

There are three categories for judging with a total of 60 points: Harmony between horse and handler, presentation of both horse and handler & Movement. For each category there is a maximum of 20 points that can be awarded. Points are accumulated during the season. Total points return to zero at the beginning of each showing season

Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers 2024 - Classes 35, 36 & 37

This competition is for Ridden Purebred Arabians. Owners of qualified horses must be members of the Arab Horse Society and the horse registered in their owner's name. The exhibitor must have purchased an AHS Q card displaying the name of the horse.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the Breed Society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependent on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, as copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com

The qualifying horse will be the highest placed, previously unqualified, exhibit within the Championship of the mare, stallion and gelding sections. If a rider has qualified more than one horse, that rider will be allowed to exchange horses and ride each horse for its individual display. A groom is allowed into the ring to hold the horse whilst it is not being ridden.

Qualifiers should be marked in the following way:

Ride 50 Maximum Conformation 50 Maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest Conformation mark will be deemed the winner. If there still be equality as this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, $9^{th} - 13^{th}$ October 2024. Qualification will not pass below 6^{th} place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

AHS Q Cards cost £35.00 per horse per season and must be purchased at least one week before the date of the class in which the horse will compete. Proceeds will be used for sponsorship at the Horse of the Year Show. The AHS website (WHEN REBUILT) will be updated regularly with the names of all horses issued with AHS Q Cards making the information available to Stewards and Show Secretaries. Results will be checked and any horse found not to have been issued with an AHS Q Card within the specified time will be deemed not to have qualified. Qualification will then pass down to the next eligible horse within the championship — There will be no opportunity to pay the fee retrospectively. Shows should record all placing in the Championship but only declare the Champion and Reserve. AHS Q Cards are available from The Arab Horse Society, Agriculture House, Charnham Lane, Hungerford RG17 0EY Please make cheques payable to Arab Horse Society. Horses \underline{must} have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1stvaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 – 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 – 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

Horses <u>must</u> have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

Horse owners are always strongly urged to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols

GENERAL INFORMATION

Numbers for showing and Entry Confirmation

Numbers will not be sent out to exhibitors. Numbers for showing may be collected at the show from the Secretary's Office. Entries will be acknowledged via e-mail only. If an exhibitor has not received an acknowledgement e-mail 4 days before the show date, the Show Secretary should be contacted.

Horse Box Parking:

Exhibitors are required to park horse boxes the designated horse box parking area, please comply with Health & Safety Regulations.

Stabling:

There are a limited number of boxes available on the showground. These loose boxes are allocated on a <u>strictly FIRST-COME-FIRST SERVED</u> basis. Boxes will cost £65.00 per night Stabling Fees include a £20.00 Clean Stable deposit will be taken upon arrival so ensure you have the funds available. Stables may be booked from 5.00 p.m. on Saturday 22nd July 2024 until the end of the show on Sunday 24th July 2024. Exhibitors are requested to leave stables in a clean condition where upon the "Clean Stable" deposit will be refunded upon inspection when the stable is vacated. Refunds will only be

made on the Showground on the day of the Show.

Stables are only considered booked upon submission of a signed Stable Booking Form and full payment of fees. A Stabling Plan will be available in the stable yard and at the Secretary's Office. Please complete the Stabling Form giving horse details. DO NOT move stable which has been allocated to you, this is a health and safety concern. YOU MUST get authorization from the Stable Manager, who can then amend any paperwork.

Bedding it is recommended that you bring additional shavings as some of the bed may have limited amount; straw is NOT permitted on the showground.

Admission to the show will again this year be FREE to spectators.

Show Sponsorship: Sponsorship packages are available for classes and championships.

<u>Refreshments</u>: Refreshments will be available at the show and will be located near the Secretary's Office.

Hon. Medical Officer: First Aid will be in attendance, based at the Secretary's Office

<u>Veterinary Officer:</u> There will be a vet On Call for the duration of the show, exhibitors will be responsible of all fees. Emergency out of hours contact details will be available from the Secretary's Office and in the Stable Yard.

Entry fee: £1 of all entry fees will go towards the running of the South East Arabian Horse Group.

SUMMER SHOW RULES AND CONDITIONS 2024

- This Show is affiliated to the Arab Horse Society (Ref: 10216) and to the European Conference of Arab Horse Organizations. The rules of both organizations apply to Pure Bred In-Hand classes but ECAHO Rules take precedence where there could be a clash or conflict. The ECAHO Disciplinary Committee is responsible for enforcing the ECAHO Rules and our Show Organizers is responsible for enforcing the AHS Rules. Other classes at the show are outside the jurisdiction of ECAHO and are governed by AHS Rules.
 - This show will be subject to The Arab Horse Society Current Show Rules and Regulations of the Arab Horse Society which are available on www.arabhorsesociety.com
- 2) This show is affiliated to the European Arab Horse Show Commission as a Class C National Show and will be conducted in accordance with the current Rules for Conduct of Shows. (Blue Book 2022) E.C.A.H.O. Aff. No: 144-2022/GB N.B. Copies of the above rules will be displayed in the Show Secretary's tent for the duration of the show. Exhibitors' attention is drawn to the changes in Championship Rules which means that a horse that does not come forward for the Championships without discussions with the DC and or a veterinary certificate will be disqualified and suspended for one year.
- 3) Objections under AHS Rules must be made in writing and submitted to the Disciplinary Committee/Show Secretary within one hour of the end of the class or the occurrence and accompanied by a deposit of £50.00 (fifty pounds). For further details, please refer to the AHS Rules for Showing.
- 4) All exhibits, foals and horses entered in AHS classes MUST be registered with the AHS in the appropriate section by the closing date of entries. Where a horse is subject to lease arrangement the Lease Agreement must be lodged with the AHS prior to the close of entries and a copy enclosed with the entry form.
- 5) No late entries, alterations or substitutions will be permitted after the closing date for entries in classes 1 to 13 and 35 to 37.
- 6) The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 7) The Show Committee may at their discretion, cancel, split or amalgamate any class/es.
- 8) In the event of their being three or less entries in a class, the first prize only will be awarded. For classes with four to six entries, only first and second prizes will be awarded. The Show Committee reserves the right to waive this restriction or award additional prizes and/or rosettes.
- 9) No entry fees will be refunded unless a class is cancelled or on production of a valid Veterinary Certificate.
- 10) The judge's decision in all cases will be final. He/she may withhold any award if there is not sufficient merit.
- 11) The Show Committee reserves the right to arrange for replacement or substitute judge if necessary.
- 12) All communication by any exhibitor to a judge must be via the appropriate steward.
- 13) No horse or rider may leave the ring without first obtaining the permission of the judge. Care has been taken over the timing of classes but in the event that exhibit finds that he/she should be in two rings at the same time, then the exhibitor must choose which class he/she prefers to exhibit in.
- 14) Any horse behaving in a dangerous manner may be asked to leave the showground.
- 15) All stallions and colts aged 3 years and over must be bitted and wear secure bridles.
- 16) All handlers are asked to wear traditional English dress.
- 17) No claim for anything that may happen to onlookers, exhibitors, owners, agents, their servants, horses or property, in connection with, or arising out of this show, or conduct or management thereof, will be recognized. Further, exhibitors must indemnify the Show Committee against all

- actions, costs, claims, demands or liability arising out of any action in which he or she may be concerned.
- 18) In the interest of safety, horses are not allowed into the separate pedestrian areas.
- 19) No person shall be mounted on the showground unless he/she is wearing a correctly fitting hard hat.
- 20) Unattended horses and ponies must not be left tied to the outside of any vehicle.
- 21) Anyone noticing an incident of neglect or ill treatment must report this to the Disciplinary Committee or Show Secretary immediately.
- 22) Cars will not be permitted to park in the pedestrian area except in special circumstances and by prior arrangement.
- 23) All dogs on the showground must be kept under control on a lead at all times and should not be left in cars in hot weather.
- 24) Stabling will be available from 5.00 p.m. on Saturday 22^{ndh} July 2024 until the end of the show on Sunday 23rd July 2024. Stables are only considered booked upon submission of a signed Stable Booking Form and full payment of fees before 8.30pm.
- 25) An exhibitor of any horse occupying a stable without prior booking or remaining in a stable after booking has expired will be required to vacate the stable immediately leaving it in a clean condition. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse show entries from an exhibitor whose horse is stabled without prior booking or is in an incorrect stable. A plan of the stable area and occupants will be lodged with the Show Secretary.
- 26) A Novice horse is one that has not been placed first in three ridden classes at novice or open level at affiliated shows prior to 1 January of the current season and/or has never qualified for HOYS. Horses that have been ridden in open classes abroad are not eligible to enter prenovice and novice classes in the UK.
- 27) All exhibits in any ridden classes must be age four years and over.
- 28) In the event of the Show having to be cancelled The South East Arabian Horse Group reserve the right to withhold 50% of entry fees paid to cover expenses.
- 29) Any exhibitor's cheques for entry fees, stabling etc. that fails to clear when presented at their bank will be required to pay all outstanding Monies and any incurred charges before being allowed to compete. The Show Committee reserve the right to refuse future show entries from that exhibitor.
- 30) Class times will only be given for the first class of the morning and afternoon sessions. Competitors are strongly advised to arrive early and watch the progression of classes for themselves. Exhibitors are responsible for being on time for their classes.
- 31) Numbers may be collected at the show from the Secretary's Office. Entries will be acknowledged by e-mail only. In the event that an exhibitor has not received an acknowledgement e-mail 4 days before the show date, the Show Secretary should be contacted. Any exhibitor not providing a current e-mail address will not have their entry acknowledged.
- 32) Not used
- 33) Home Produced: Open to Horses, which are either stabled at home or in a D. I. Y. yard and which since 1st January 2024 have not been shown by a Professional during the current season or stabled in a Professional yard at any time in 2023 To be handled/ridden by an Amateur. This does not exclude Amateur Owner Home Producer having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. No Professional Producers are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.
- 34) Any person or persons on the showground behaving in a rude, abusive, or dangerous manner likely to compromise the health and safety and the enjoyment of anyone attending the show may be asked to leave the showground.
- 35) Any person or persons who are on the showground for any reason whatsoever, either before, during or after the show is deemed to have agreed to abide by the South East

- Arabian Horse Group Summer Show Rules and Conditions 2024.
- 36) Pre-Novice Classes 29 & 30 Pre-Novice Ridden Horse must be 4 years old and over and will be judged as a riding horse. The judge will NOT ride. A short individual show will be required. Four years olds to be in ordinary snaffle bridle and bit (as BD Rules). Spurs will not be worn. A Pre-Novice horse is one that has not been placed first more than two times at an
 - affiliated show. Horses entered in <u>Pre-Novice classes may not enter OPEN classes</u> at the same show. Pre-Novice classes are not qualifiers for any championships. Being placed first in a Pre-Novice class does not change the Novice status of a horse under the AHS Rules for Showing.
- 37) Crabbet classes: Horses must be pure bred Arabian and have 75% or over Crabbet and/or Old English bloodlines.
- 38) Crabbet Related classes: Horses must be pure Arabian and have one parent only with 75% or over Crabbet and/or Old English bloodlines
- 39) Crabbet & Crabbet related classes: All horses forward MUST be shown in a natural manner. The pose must be natural, i.e., one fore leg slightly behind the other and one hind leg slightly behind the other. The head should be held with the neck showing natural arch and curve of throat line, so that the neck is not uncomfortably stretched or raised. The horse should be trained to stand sensibly in this position with expression of interest in the handler. A frozen pose is unacceptable.
- 40) Crabbet & Crabbet related classes: Any unnatural posing, flicking with a whip or circling when being run out, will result, at the Judge's discretion, in the horse being judged as though no presentation or display had been possible and therefore penalized accordingly.
- 41) Equine Influenza: Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1stvaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.
